

## Elementary Education Add-On Certification Policy University of South Carolina-Columbia

Policies and procedures regarding the addition of a teaching certification area to the initial certification area are determined **solely by the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE)**. The SCDE determines the specific course work and test(s) necessary to add a certification. The SCDE regulations – course work, test requirements, etc. – regarding add-on certification may be found at <http://www.scteachers.org/cert/addlcert.cfm>.

Students may choose to take courses required for add-on certification at the University of South Carolina-Columbia. Some students choose to work toward an add-on certification while completing their initial certification program. Course requirements are listed in general terms in the Certification Manual to accommodate all state institutions. **It is strongly recommended that students ask the SCDE to confirm that they will accept a specific USC-Columbia course(s) for add-on purposes, as changes may occur without prior notification.**

### **Adding-on Elementary Certification (grades 2-6)**

The following table lists the **USC-Columbia courses** which the SCDE accepted **August 8, 2010** to fulfill the academic course requirements for students adding-on Elementary certification. Upon request, the SCDE will evaluate other course work to determine if it will fulfill these academic requirements.

\*Courses numbered 100-400 can only be taken for undergraduate credit. Some 500 and 600 level courses are offered only for undergraduate credit, but most 500 and 600 level courses may be taken for graduate credit. In order to receive graduate credit for a 500 or 600 level course which is offered for graduate credit, candidates must be admitted as graduate students. Candidates must apply and be admitted to the USC Graduate School as either degree-seeking students or non-degree-seeking students via the USC Graduate School’s Non-Degree-Enrollment Privilege.
